

Joyous Christmas Story for Nomads of Mongolia Christmas 2024 in Ukraine

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The Star of Bethlehem And Great Commission Media Ministries

The Christmas story would be incomplete without mentioning the star that led the wise men to baby Jesus in a stall in Bethlehem.

The wise men from the East asked Herod: "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and are come to worship Him."

And so, traditional Christmas celebrations include a tree with tree topper stars.

Stars are mentioned often on the pages of the Bible. God created the stars on the fourth day of the creation narrative. (Genesis 1:16) It is God alone who directs the stars of heaven in the universe. (Job 9:7)

Look Up and See

In Psalms 8:3-4 David writes: "When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them?"

It's doubtful that a star ever had as important a role as that of the night when Jesus was born.

The Psalmist tells us (19:1): "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands." Visible to the naked eye, a person at best can count a few thousand stars in the heavens.

100 Thousand Million Stars

Astronomers can count the number of stars in the known universe using high-resolution devices that measure space electromagnetic fields.

- NASA estimates that there are about two trillion galaxies in the observable universe.
- It is estimated that every galaxy has on average, 100 thousand million stars.

100 Thousand Million x 2 Trillion

Multiply two trillion galaxies with 100 thousand million stars. The number is so large that astronomers describe the result with a special term, ie. 2e + 23. Regardless of the size and location of the star, God's fingerprints are visible in each of the 2e+23 stars. The Bible says, God has determined the number of the stars and calls them by name. (Psalm 147:4) We call the star on the first Christmas night "The Star of Bethlehem!"

The Prophet Isaiah said: "Lift up your eyes and look to the heavens: Who created all these? He who brings out the starry host one by one and calls forth each of them by name."

One can only imagine the euphoria and enthusiasm of the kings from the East when they saw the star, whose one and only task was to lead these oriental dignitaries to the Savior of mankind.

Some have said that the "star" was nothing more than a supernova, a planetary formation, a meteor or an errant comet.

But this star did not travel across the sky at random! It moved purposefully. It appeared with intentionality and disappeared for a calculated moment in time as well.



Meanwhile, the wise men sought further clarification from King Herod in Jerusalem as they continued their search for the new-born king.

According to the Scriptures, the star appeared again and led them to Bethlehem-precisely to the place "where the child was." The star never appeared again. It had fulfilled its mission. The star had led the kingly seekers to the King of Kings.

Multitudes of Mongolians have personally heard and received the gospel message. The first weeks of the campaign saw the first church plant of new 45 believers on a hillside slope of Ulaanbaatar. Many other churches have been planted since. The Gospel continues to advance and there is more to come. Thank you for your financial support and prayers.





The nomads of Mongolia have enthusiastically embraced the gospel message in the distant Uvs province, where tribes conduct a traditional nomadic way of life.

The evangelism campaign events have been sizably attended. This has been encouraging to see as it has been reminiscent of the revival that IRR-TV experienced in Russia after the collapse of the Soviet Union in the 1990s.

Powerful Campaign Continues

The Mongolian campaign has been exceptionally successful. Although the country is vast and far, the proclaimed gospel message has reached the outermost villages and has received a widely acclaimed response.

Churches are already planning the city-wide evangelistic event at the largest stadium in Ulaanbaatar for next summer and will be inviting 60,000 guests to attend.

Mongolian churches continue moving forward with a clear vision of reaching their nation with The Gospel.



War in the Middle East Disrupts Traditional Christmas Celebrations

GCMM has been ministering to Jews since the early 2000s. The first media training seminars were organized for congregations in Haifa.

Successful media campaigns followed in Hebrew, Russian, and Arabic in Jerusalem, Tel Aviv, and Haifa.

As a result, one core ministry of GCMM has developed to reach Russian-speaking Jews in Russia, Ukraine, and Israel.

Media Conveys Campaign Message to Millions

Media campaigns covering the whole of Israel have resonated with tens of thousands of people. Additionally, several local outreach and evangelistic campaigns have taken place. People have been directed to local congregations for follow-up ministry

through call centers, having received campaign books. Over the years, thousands of Jews have had the opportunity to experience the living God! New congregations and small groups have emerged.

TV Programs on YouTube

We have produced several evangelistic program series for TV in Russian for over ten years. This includes programs filmed on location, such as "Getting to Know Israel" and the talk show series Shabbat Shalom.

A weekly news program produced by Jerusalem Dateline CBN is modified into a Russian

version in Kyiv. During the war in the Middle East, the program's viewership figures on YouTube have grown exponentially.

Helping in Times of Need and Resisting Antisemitism

We comfort those suffering during Jewish crises and wars by providing humanitarian aid in both Israel and Ukraine.

Likewise, we oppose the growing anti-Semitism in the world by sharing correct information about Israel and teaching the importance of the spiritual roots of our faith in God at this critical time in history.

When Hamas terrorists attacked, murdering, raping, and robbing one hundred thousand inhabitants of the villages around



Gaza they had to flee to other areas of Israel.

Since then, around 80,000 people have had to be evacuated from their homes under Hezbollah's rocket rain.

In the early days of the war, we supported the village of Jad HaShmona near Jerusalem, founded by our Finnish partners. The village received refugees who needed accommodations, clothing, food, and psychological support.

The congregations in the Ashdod region are involved in extensive relief work for both new immigrants and war victims. We provide support as resources allow.

Israeli Jews Arrive in Finland After Hostilities of War

At the beginning of this fall, many Israelis who had experienced the horrors of wartime terrorism arrived in North Karelia, eastern Finland.

Initially, a retreat had been planned to accommodate 25 participants, however, because of the war, most flights were cancelled out of Tel Aviv. A total of 16 participants were able to arrive.

More than anything, the retreat attendees needed spiritual care and consolation.

From the Kibbutz of Death to Safety

Among the participants were Jewish youth who had been at the kibbutz of the deadliest terrorist attack. The youth hid in a hole in the ground for 12 hours, watching how young women, men, and children died around them. When they finally got out to safety, they followed funerals in mass,

where they had to say goodbye to their friends.

God's Love and Embrace

Instead of many Bible seminars, a lot of time was spent talking, hiking and taking in the beautiful scenery of Karelia.

The presence of the Holy Spirit was powerful throughout the entire week. It did not touch only the Israelis but everyone, including the Finnish kitchen and service staff. Prayer was born as if by itself around evening campfires and nature trails, and God blessed it. Those who were at the camp for the retreat and all of Israel still need our intercessory prayers. The Bible assures us: "Indeed, he who watches Israel will neither slumber nor sleep."



In Ukraine, Christmas is on Hold

Christmas celebrations are being held across North America. Trees are being decorated, and candles are being lit. Families are coming together, enjoying wonderful Christmas meals. Gifts are being given to loved ones. Many will attend Christmas services, celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Ukrainian energy engineers announced that Russia continues to attack the energy sector. Russian missiles have destroyed churches and have struck power stations and grids across the nation, leaving untold thousands of families in frigid temperatures without electricity. We are witnessing a humanitarian crisis unfolding before our eyes.

A Disaster at Hand

The situation is dire. The Ukrainian energy sector was beginning to recover

from the last two years of missile strikes, but as the cold weather has arrived, strikes have intensified.

Ukrainian authorities warn that should Moscow carry out further strikes against Ukraine's three nuclear plants as winter temperatures plummet, the situation will be catastrophic.

Sweeping power outages in the larger cities are expected, whereby sources of heat to keep warm, cook food, and for hygiene are a challenge this winter.



"Peace on Earth, Good Will to Men" Will be a Distant Dream and a Fervent Prayer in Ukraine



Most Difficult in Eastern Ukraine

Many villages haven't had electricity since summer. Families with children and senior citizens cannot survive in freezing conditions without a source of heat for warmth, cooking, and hygiene.

As a result of the war and the Russian missile strikes, children go to school in basements, bomb shelters, and subway station tunnels. Between the fall of 2022 and the winter of 2023-24, GCMM has with thanks to our friends and supporters, financed and delivered over 10,000 woodburning stoves to cities and villages in East Ukraine.

Wood-Burning Stoves are Needed

As Russia's horrific invasion of Ukraine continues to escalate, the need for more stoves continues. Thousands of orders for wood-burning stoves pour into our Kyiv office every week. We have recently ordered 500 stoves from factories in Kyiv and Zaporizhzhia for a unit cost of \$150 USD.

Every Gift is Deeply Appreciated

Every donated dollar is received with gratitude. It brings relief to families with children in Ukraine. Together, we can deliver thousands more stoves.

It's all about helping families survive the winter. The wood-burning stove is not limited to keeping warm. When there is no electricity, it can be used for cooking, health and hygiene throughout the year. Other aid has been delivered as well.

GCMM has delivered over five thousand tons of aid during this war.

This past fall, Ukrainians



received aid for schools being conducted underground.

All in all, humanitarian aid has been delivered to families in northeastern Ukraine, from Sumy and Kharkiv down to Odesa on the Black Sea.

The shipments have included stoves, backup power units, batteries, aggregates, chargers, inverters, power tools, welding equipment, protective blan-

kets, industrial air conditioners, children's hospital beds, intensive care equipment, a mobile dental unit, and a trailer with shower and washing facilities.

For schools: classroom furniture, interactive boards, wheelchairs, sleeping bags, winter boots, winter footwear for children, winter coats, wool socks, and kitchen appliances for home economics classes.



Pastor of the Moscow Pentecostal Church Arrested

On October 19th in Moscow, Evangelical Pastor, Nikolai Nikolajevits Romaniuk of the Holy Trinity Church was arrested after the Sunday service.

The arrest included a thorough home search, conducted in a very rude manner. Pastor Romaniuk is being accused of collaboration with Western intelligence services.

Fabricated Accusations

The accusations are fabricated and belong to the traditional FSB (Russia's Federal Security Service) workings and lies.

The names of Laura and Hannu Haukka were also mentioned during the Moscow home search and arrest.

The pastor's entire family experienced great psychological trauma as a result. Such searches and arrests in present-day Russia are unfortunately predictable and to be expected.

Heavy Handed House Search

During the house searches, hood-

ed Russian secret police special forces with loaded Kalashnikovs were on site. The family's children were forced to lie face down on the floor, with their hands behind their heads, for six hours.

Refusal to Support the War

The most prevalent accusation against Pastor Nikolai Romaniuk was that he expressed his disagreement against the brutal war that the Russian Federation is waging in Ukrainian territory.

In Russia, citizens whose lives line up with the truth of the Bible and Christian worldview and even those with a sense of justice will suffer, regardless of their faith or lack thereof.

A fellow pastor shared: "I have known Nikolai Romaniuk since our youth and have known the family well, including his father Nikolai Vasilievich from

the Ternopil region in Ukraine.

Soviet Style Persecution Makes Comeback

During the years of Soviet persecution and oppression, Nikolai's father was a Pentecostal church pastor in Moscow and suffered greatly because of his faith. He was sent to a prison camp in Siberia for 18 years.

Nikolai's older brother Vasili, also a pastor, died under very mysterious circumstances in a Moscow hospital due to an unknown illness.

In 2012, the Romaniuk brothers' church building, where they pastored, was demolished by bulldozers late one night.

The Kremlin regime continues its illegal activities, and one question remains: "God, how long will this continue?!"

While waiting for more information, we ask friends to pray for our Christian brother Nikolai, as he awaits the fate of his arrest.

Moscow, the destruction of the Holy Trinity Church began in the dead of the night on September 6th, 2012. The threestorey building was destroyed by heavy-duty excavating equipment.


The local authorities had sent workers to cut the phone lines of the church, confiscating the acting caretaker's cell phone, who was then taken to the police station where she was held for three hours during the destruction. The woman was not allowed to contact the leadership of the church while in custody.

Romaniuk concluded, "All this was done under police protection, so state authorities must have been the client."

According to eyewitnesses, about 50 young men were involved in the nightly destruction lasting several hours. The men said they were Druzhinniki who were mainly known to be volunteers, helping control violence and unruly crowds.

In this case, however, they were the ones who rioted, with some intoxicated and prevented access to the area. The youths were shouting obscenities and assaulted some church members who came onto the scene.

According to Romaniuk, "Members of the congregation who tried to take photos were pelted with a rain of stones. They did not have official authorization or power of attorney documents for what they were doing. The church was destroyed, and the property stolen was worth about 50,000 USD. The damages to the church were at least 350,000 USD."



Pastors Across Russia Sentenced Under Anti-Terrorism Law

Church activities under strict surveillance

Religious freedoms in Russia have weakened at an alarming rate since 2016. The US Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF) reported at the time that for the first time in more than 20 years, Russia was on the list of countries that restrict religious freedom the most, along with China and North Korea.

In July 2016 when the anti-terrorism law was approved, freedoms for evangelical churches began to dissipate. Within a year, the activities of the churches were impeded in many ways. Church services were suspended, many pastors were arrested and even expelled from the country, and Christian literature was confiscated.

A Draconian Law

The situation became worrisome for evangelical churches

in Russia and was reminiscent of the Soviet era.

Churches Faithful to the Word of God are Targeted

Vladimir Rjahovski, a lawyer defending the rights of evangelical churches, stated that 74 legal cases in 2016 had referred to the new anti-terrorism law.

All 74 trials affected pastors from the evangelical churches.

Rjahovski noted that it seemed the law was specifically targeting churches.

Latest Attack in Moscow

Russian Pentecostal and Baptist church leadership have reported to GCMM about persecution measures. After the law came into force, the security authorities made surprise appearances church events in several cities. These included Perm, Moscow, Kaluga, Arkhan-Syktyvkar, gelsk, Novokuznetsk, collected the personal information of those present. Fines were also issued.

In Moscow, 30 security police and other authorities descended upon a worship service at the Pentecostal church. All entrances to the building were blocked. No one was allowed to leave while they gathered personal data, accompanied by fines.

Will Not Ring in Russia

In 2015, Christmas bells were no longer rung in bell towers. Chords of discord by the Russian Federation replaced the ringing of bells signifying Christmas peace. The new law, which severely restricts the work of the churches, came into effect.

Year by year, the law tightened its grip. Following the Russian invasion of Ukraine, church outreach and mission work were completely banned. Long gone are the days of Superbook, the children's animated cartoon series shown on Soviet and Russian State Television. Those unforgettable 52 best Bible stories deeply impacted and shook a nation that had wandered in the wilderness of atheism for seventy years.

More than a million letters poured in as viewers responded to

the Superbook Bible series in just four weeks. The programs instilled faith into the children's hearts and resonated with adults from various walks of life, including cosmonauts and members of the Communist Party.

In cooperation with Russian churches, GCMM had the opportunity to carry out dozens of large-scale Mega City Campaigns throughout Russia. Thousands of copies of Christian literature were printed for evangelical church outreaches even before churches realized a time would

come when Russia would have to close its doors to evangelism.

By the end of 2022, more than 7 million campaign books, the Gospel of John, the New Testament and Bibles had been printed.

Books have been an important tool in church outreach. Bishop Eduard Grabovenko of the Russian evangelical churches announced that their congregations have taken the Gospel to about 20,000 villages and population centers. Over the years, more than a million people who attended the evangelistic services made personal declarations of faith. There are still 80,000 population centers in Russia where the Gospel has not yet been heard.

MUSLIMS HAVE THE RIGHT TO HEAR

Viewer feedback



More than 1.5 billion Muslims living in the Middle East have yet to hear the Gospel freely. GCMM continues to fully commit to broadcasting the gospel message to the people of the Middle East on daily broadcasts via 18 satellites. Monthly feedback from about 200,000 viewers each month is inspiring. Here are some excerpts:

Yasin, Morocco

Following his Islamic studies, Yasin worked as an imam in a mosque. During his studies, he noticed some contradictions, mistakes, and issues in the Koran that troubled him. In particular, the verses about Maryam's (Mary's) son and Prophet Isa (Jesus) captured his attention.

Yasin started watching our TV programs and learned more about Jesus. He called and asked many questions because he was seeking the truth. After our team answered his questions, he a ccepted Jesus as his Savior.

After this, Yasin continued to pray in the mosque every morning and fulfilled his duties as an imam. As a result, however, he did not have full peace in his newfound faith in Jesus.

Eventually, encouraged by our team, Yasin left his position at the mosque. A brother from the team drove late into the night to a rural village to meet him and directed Yasin to a believing pastor who has been helping him grow in faith through God's word.

Omar, Algeria

Omar was a very devoted Muslim who could not tolerate Christians.

He persecuted Christians and tried to convert them to Islam online.

One day, he watched a TV program that touched him deeply and began to seek truth with persistence.

Omar reached out to the Algeria team through Facebook. He started calling the number and asking questions. A month later, he gave his life to the Lord. Omar did not want his neighbors knowing about his conversion to Christianity, so he started going to meetings with believers in another village.

Kamal, Egypt

Kamal is an Egyptian man married to a devout Muslim woman. Despite his wife's devotion to Islam, Kamal had Christian friends at work who made him curious. He wanted to know why they were so joyful and ethically moral.

One day, he found our TV programs while flipping channels on satellite TV. Kamal started watching our shows regularly to find out what set our programs apart, having noticed that his Christian friends were different from everyone else he knew.

THE STORY OF BETHLEHEM AS WELL

Kamal felt that there was something misguided in Islam, but he didn't know why he felt so unsettled about it. He contacted the follow-up team at the satellite TV channel and asked us about Christianity. Our team shared that Christ doesn't want to give him a new religion but wants a personal relationship with Kamal himself!

After communicating with our team for a few days, Kamal prayed with them on the phone and accepted Christ into his heart! He told us that he had immediately felt peace and joy come into his heart.

Together with Kamali, we are reading through the Gospel of Luke. He is hungry to know the truth! Please pray with us that he remains safe and may one day lead his entire family to Christ.

Maryam, Middle East

"I love the heartwarming messages I receive from you, which flow directly from the Lord's heart to mine. I have been in the faith for seven years. I grew up in a non-religious family, and my father was a communist. I have six brothers and two sisters. All of us, including our mother, followed

in my father's footsteps with no sign of God in our family.

I often asked my father questions—what is our identity, why don't we believe in anything, what is the purpose of our existence? He was never able to answer me.

My father was blind, so he had us read books aloud to him. Thanks to that, we were generally well-informed about things.

I became a Christian through a strange event about seven years ago when I was a broken and angry person. I was emotionally exhausted. I watched your programs on the TV. I smoked cigarettes and drank alcohol to make myself feel better. I had an obsessive-compulsive disorder (which I thank God I don't have anymore).

As a part of my regular cleaning routine, I reached up to clean a shelf in the closet where a bag belonging to my son had been for a long time. Right when I decided to open it to look inside, the bag slid down and fell on my head. This unexpectedly led me to a crossroads in my life.

Two books fell out of the bag, one of which was a Bible, and opened to Psalm 71. I had never seen or read a Bible before, so I sat down and read Psalm 71. It touched my heart, and I began to cry. I called a family member who I knew had become a Christian and told them I needed peace. While they were talking to me, I cried non-stop. He told me that I needed to repent and turn to Christ.


I repented and prayed a prayer for salvation. I went to see my relative, who serves other believers in a village, and he baptized me. Since then, I have been serving the Lord. "Faith comes by hearing and hearing through the word of God."

For the last seven years, I have been especially devoted to hearing the word of the Lord so that by hearing His words, my weaknesses can turn into strengths.

I love Jesus Christ so much that without His presence, I cannot even breathe. I know what it feels like to be in His presence. I am very thankful that I have come to know His truth. Please pray that my three children will find a deep saving faith."

Global Christian Leader Summit

The BOC (Body of Christ) Global & Revival Summit was held in the city of Hyderabad, India, in November. Eleven thousand Christian leaders attended from five continents and more than 50 countries.

A birthday celebration during the global summit was held at the Rajiv Gandhi Stadium. It was dedicated to the Pastor and Founder Satish Kumar of the church and the congregation to which 78,000 quests had been invited.

Among the congratulators at the celebration was the Chief Minister of the Indian state of
